

The Scholarship Fund

Purpose

To provide financial support through scholarships (minimum \$500.00) to persons preparing for a career in Christian service.

Application Criteria

- * The applicant must be planning a career in Christian service.
- * The applicant must be, or have been within the past ten years, an active member of Knox Presbyterian Church.
- * The applicant must be accepted for admission to or already enrolled in a fully accredited college, university, or seminary at either the undergraduate or graduate level. Preference will be given to students with advanced standing. The scholarship is not automatically renewable; however, successful applicants can reapply to the fund in subsequent years and will be considered with all other applicants that year.

This scholarship fund honors the commitment of Anne T. Sherren to her church and to her profession. Anne has faith in tomorrow because of the youth of today, and she is excited about the help and encouragement this scholarship fund is providing in developing these leaders.

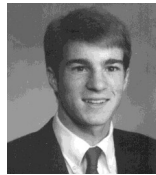
The Vision

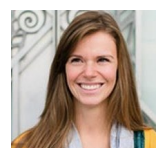

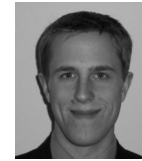
